Field Conservation Technician with the PEI Watershed Alliance

The successful candidate will work with the PEI Watershed Alliance (PEIWA), watershed groups and interested stakeholders on an island wide project to monitor endangered bat species and assist groups with water quality and wildlife monitoring initiatives. The ideal candidate will be detail orientated and organized to handle numerous data files efficiently and effectively.

Job activities include:

- Assist with bat monitoring program using NA BAT monitoring protocols including
 - o Data entry and interpretation of bat acoustic files
 - o Deployment/retrieval of bat monitoring equipment
 - o Maintenance of equipment
- Assist PEIWA equipment manager in distribution of field equipment to watershed groups across the island
- Assist watershed groups in field data collection
- Assist with basic data analyses and uploading of data

Requirements:

- Post-secondary student in biology, environmental studies, wildlife ecology or related field
- Proficient with data entry using Microsoft Office programs and google platforms.
- Ability to work as a team member and work collaboratively with stakeholders and watershed groups
- Self-motivated individual who can work remotely with minimal supervision
- Ability to work outside in various weather conditions
- Ability to accommodate a varying work schedule including some evenings and weekends
- A reliable vehicle and cell phone required (mileage and phone per diem covered by PEIWA)
